It is almost that time again - the SNAP seminar. We have an exciting seminar lined up for members and guests. The seminar will be held on Friday, May 10, 2013, at the Northern Nevada Bar Center, 9456 Double R Blvd. Suite B, in Reno.

ASIAN COLE SLAW

4c shredded cabbage*
1c shredded carrots*
1 small onion, finely chopped (adjust to taste)
Pinch S&P, to taste

1-1/2T rice vinegar 1-1/4t sesame oil 1/2t hot red chili sauce 1/3c mayonnaise 1T sesame seeds (optional)

Toss the cabbage, carrots, and onion with the S&P. Mix the remaining ingredients together, except the sesame seeds. Pour the sauce mixture over the tossed vegetables and blend thoroughly. Add the sesame seeds and toss lightly.

for the Executive Council of the State Bar of Nevada, Family Law Section; 👬 and is currently the President of the Washoe County Bar Association.




Shawn B. Meador graduated from Utah State University, and attended law school at the University
